The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in another cancellation of our 2nd Night Community Passover Seder. We did hold our joint Yom Hashoah Memorial Service with the UUCOB in late April and received 14 essays from Dare County, giving out 4 awards.

While all of our Shabbat services have been held virtually, via ZOOM, we plan to switch back to in-person services beginning with our Saturday service on September 17th at 10AM.

I have been teaching Hebrew to 3 young ladies and 3 adults for the last 2 years with the goal of celebrating a Bat Mitzvah. I am pleased to note that they are all now able to read Hebrew and are preparing for Bat Mitzvahs in 2024.

Beach Food Pantry:

The Beach Food Pantry (BFP) located in Kitty Hawk continues its mission to offer food and other basic necessities to all those who are food insecure in Dare County.

The BFP provides non perishable groceries, refrigerated and fresh fruits and vegetables, bread and other bakery items, as well as poultry, pork, beef, and fish. Dog and cat food are also provided for clients who have pets. Rather than dispose of it, food that must be purged due to expiration or bad condition, is offered to local farmers to feed their livestock.

The JCOB is one of the many organizations volunteering to serve clients at the BFP. We currently are scheduled one afternoon a month We would like to acknowledge our regular volunteer group that has helped thus far in 2022.
